Pilot of Scab control plans

- •Following on from work carried out last winter.
- 2 farms to be identified
- Farm with *Psoroptes ovis* infestation identified and confirmed through skin scrapes
- Contiguous farms identified and blood sampling for ELISA testing carried out
- Treatment of all animals on farms using Dipping contractors
- •1 Common to be identified and all farms using that common to be screened with ELISA and treated as required.

Progress to date

Area 1

- 5 farms in total
- 4 tested
 - 3 Positive,
 - 1 result pending
- 1 farm not compliant
- 3 positive farms dipped

Area 2

- 8 Farms
- 8 tested
 - 2 positive
 - 3 negative
 - 3 Pending
- 3 positive farms dipped

Next steps

- Grant application submitted to BBSRC for a one year project
- Focused on endemic disease, using sheep scab as a case study

Explore and address knowledge gaps

More detailed prevalence study

Explore barriers to effective control at farm level

Economic & environmental cost

Conclusion

- Strong group with industry wide buy-in and support
- Ultimately want to see scab eradicated
- Need further research before we can implement a programme to achieve this
